New High School Update

Did you happen to follow all the chatter on social media around the time the division asked for input on a name for the new high school? Did you think it should be named after someone who had made an impact on the community in days gone by? Were you one of the many that thought it should stay as Niverville Collegiate institute with hopes to carry on tradition, the logo and branding? Not sure what names were included in the 100 name suggestions put forward to the board-appointed Naming Committee...but the safe choice was made, one that aligns with the Board's desire for the school name to retain its distinct community identity - Niverville High School (NHS) it shall be.



NCI Parent Council is pleased to welcome Mrs. Kimberley Funk as the first Principal of the new high school in Niverville. Mrs. Funk has been the Vice Principal of Landmark Collegiate since 2013 and will transition into her new role this month. Previous to Mrs. Funk's current position, she was Guidance Counsellor at Steinbach Regional Secondary School from 2010-2013. Mrs. Funk will bring teaching experience to her new role, having taught at Mitchell Elementary School and Mitchell Middle School from 2000-2010, and at Niverville Elementary School from 1994-1999.

Say What?! - No Cafeteria?

As some may be aware, the floor plan for Niverville High School appears to be lacking a designated dining area for students. The lunch time ritual is not only important for obvious physiological reasons, but also a significant social convention, sharing in the company of friends and colleagues is inherent to relationship building and social skills development.

Superintendent Randy Dueck assures that some ideas are already in the works to address the need for a lunch time space: “As we have developed and

designed the new school we have identified the open space that is bordered by the multi purpose room, the entrance and the kitchen as one location where students might eat lunch.” Mr. Dueck further explains that the finishing touches, in particular the choice of furniture would need to be adequate to provide the right eating environment for students: “It is also quite likely that we could have tables set up in the multi purpose room where students could eat their lunch.”

It seems peculiar that a cafeteria would not be an automatic factor into a school designed for maturing students, but Mr. Dueck explains, “the Public Schools Finance Board (PFSB) does not provide any funding for a school cafeteria throughout the province.” HSD faced similar issues when it came to building Clearspring Middle School and the addition to the SRSS. Mr. Dueck further notes that PFSB is more limited than it was some 40 years ago, stating, “it is clear from PSFB that there is not enough funds to even construct all of the classrooms needed in this province.”

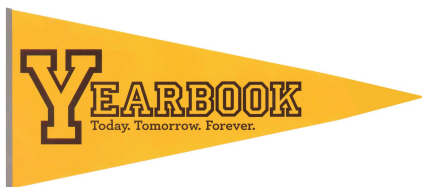
The PAC expects to learn more in the coming months regarding lunch time routines and possible meal options at NHS as Principal Funk prepares for her role and shares her plans and vision for the school. Are you interested in providing input when it comes to the new high school? Please come out to the next PAC meeting!

What about the middle years you might ask? Mr. Koester shared with PAC that for the middle school NMS, Son City will continue to offer a weekly Tuesday lunch menu for grade 5-8 students. PAC has the opportunity to plan an additional lunch offering at NMS if there are coordinators and volunteers to make it work. There will not be staff resources available so it needs to be completely parent run or it won't happen! We need volunteers by the March 4th meeting so please consider how you, or someone you know, can help!

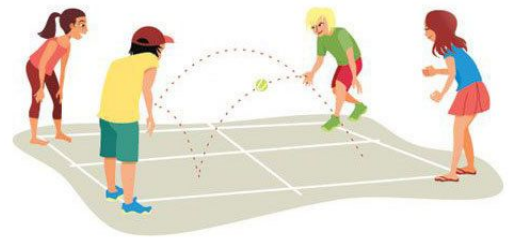


This will be the last yearbook as NCI - it will be a memorable keepsake for all students especially the last graduating class of NCI 2019.

Did you Know...?....

When the game reached North America in 1929, bingo was originally called "beano". It was first played at a carnival near Atlanta, Georgia. It was a country fair game where a dealer would select numbered discs from a cigar box and players would mark their cards with beans. They yelled "beano" if they won. New York toy salesman Edwin S. Lowe renamed it "bingo" after he overheard someone accidentally yell "bingo" instead of "beano." Lowe hired a Columbia University math professor, Carl Leffler, to help him increase the number of combinations in bingo cards. By 1930, Leffler had invented 6,000 different bingo cards. Lowe's company was sold to Milton Bradley in 1973 for \$26 million. Lowe died in 1986.
